## WHAT IS NEW AT OUR SUMMER SHOW

**New classes:** Because of the vast varieties of hydrangeas we have decided to divide them into four classes.

1. Single stem Mophead Hydrangea
2. Single Stem Lace-Cap Hydrangea
3. Single Stem Panicle Hydrangea (including *H paniculata*, *H quercifolia*)
4. Single Stem Any Other Hydrangea

**Floral Art:** We now have two sections in floral art, general section and novice section (for exhibitors who have not won 3 or more champions in floral art). The peoples choice voting will continue.

**Peron's Prize:** Our Nathe Barwick has kindly offered to sponsor a separate award for this show. A prize will be given to celebrate a stand-out flower. This flower may not be perfect but it's beauty and gracefulness stands out.

Entries are restricted to members of participating garden clubs:

- There is no limit to the number of entries per exhibitor per class and exhibitors are encouraged to enter exhibits in the rest of the show classes
- Pot plants need to have been grown by the owner for more than 6 month (pls use saucer under pots). **Maximum size of Pot Plants is 300mm**
- There is no competition between clubs, but within each club there is a prize awarded for Club Champion, which is selected from class 1, and Best Exhibit from classes 2-12
- Iles Trophy is the only inter-club competition with the champion Lily being judged from class 1

Cl 1 - 1 stem Lillium, any kind

Cl 2 - 1 single flower Lillium

Cl 3 - 1 stem Rose, any kind

Cl 4 - 1 stem Fuchsia, any kind

Cl 5 - 1 stem Dahlia, any kind

Cl 6 - 1 stem Gladiolus, any kind

Cl 7 - 1 stem Hydrangea, any kind

Cl 8 - 1 stem any other flower not listed in classes 1 to 7

Cl 9 - Container of mixed flowers, any kind

Cl 10 - 1 pot plant in flower

Cl 11 - 1 pot plant not in flower - foliage only

Cl 12 - Fruit or vegetables (1 large or 3 small)

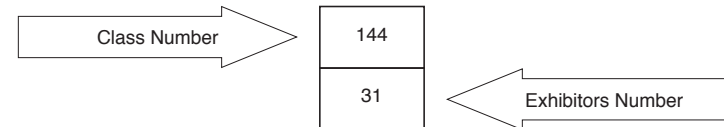

**Rules and Codes**

- All Liliams should be staged in separate containers unless otherwise stated
- Champion Rose will be selected from ALL ROSES BENCHED
- NND = Not Necessarily Different
- Judges can award champions from any section of the show
- A single lily flower is to be on its own stalk but should not be attached to any part of the stem.
- In any class where there are numerous entries, judges will subdivide the class at their discretion.
